## SAVED BY GRACE

It seems amazing that the concept of being saved by grace is not preached on more in this area. You would think that among those who view salvation as an emotional response of asking Jesus into your heart, that they would also like to use the word grace a lot. Perhaps I don't hear a lot of specifics about grace over the radio and television because of the true New Testament teaching on the subject. Let me show you from the scriptures what I mean.

**"...if I "trust in Him to save me" with all my might, will I be saved?"**

We are definitely saved by grace, but nowhere does the Bible say that God will just hand you salvation on a silver platter regardless of your faith and obedience. *"Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;) and hath raised [us] up together, and made [us] sit together in heavenly [places] in Christ Jesus: that in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in [his] kindness toward us through Christ Jesus.*

*For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: [it is] the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast." (Ephesians 2:5-9).* See the end of this page on a key Bible word in connection with all this, the word is propitiation.

Our salvation by grace through faith is something which requires us to deny the ungodly ways of the world. *"For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world..." (Titus 2:11, 12).* Question: What if we will not deny the worldly lusts? Will God still save us? If I say the Lord's name over and over, if I "trust in Him to save me" with all my might, will I be saved?

The scripture clearly teaches us that in order to be saved by God's grace he requires that we accept His favor and salvation by believing on Jesus, repenting of our sins (Acts 2:38), confessing Jesus (Romans 10:10), and being baptized (Acts 2:38). *"Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: by whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God." (Romans 5:1,2)*

Having accepted God's grace, we must live a life of faith to remain in it. If we do not remain faithful, we will fall from grace, no matter what some other preachers would tell you. *"Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace." (Galatians 5:4).* How can you fall from that which you did not once stand upon? How can Christ become of no effect unto you unless He once was of effect unto your soul? Some Galatian brethren stand in warning to us today not to rely on any other for salvation. Let us all accept the gift of God on His terms and stay true to our commitment. --Tim McHenry--
