Requiring Children to Study the Bible

I know of but one way of explaining the fact that a man claiming to believe the Bible can doubt the duty and obligation of parents to require their children to study the Bible. It is this: I knew an

experienced and thoughtful lawyer that insisted that every man had his crazy spot, and on some subject and at some point everyone is crazy.

For a parent to require a child to wash his face and keep his body clean, and not require him to learn and obey the Bible, is to teach him that the body is worth more than a pure heart and a clean and holy spirit.

For a parent to require a child to learn spelling and reading and arithmetic, and not require the child to study the Bible, is to teach it, by forcible object les-son, that it is more important to be qualified to live in this world than to be fitted to live in heaven. There is no evading these simple truths.

The parent that so treats and impresses his child is the worst enemy that child has. He will be made to feel this when he meets that child at the judgment of God. It is better to face the question honestly now.

Editor's note: It is a legitimate question to ask, "How do I know when I should make my child do something that he/she should do?" Well, it depends on whether the doing of it requires a willing heart. To make them keep themselves clean is good for them whether they choose to wash or not. On the other hand, to make a child get baptized would do no good, since it requires a willing faith behind the act (Mark 16:16)! This also helps explain why the government should not force people to become Christians – it would do them no good in the sight of God.
