Your Bible Questions answered:

- 1) What does the Bible teach on being filled with the Holy Ghost?

 Christians have the Holy Spirit, Romans 8:9 "But ye are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you. But if any man hath not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his." However, this does not mean that Christians have a miraculous gift from the Spirit. For example, in Acts 8 some had been converted but the Holy Spirit had not fallen upon them, verse 16.
- 2) What about speaking in unknown tongues?

 In Acts 2, verse 4 says that they began to speak in other tongues.

 Verse 6 says that they were speaking a "language". Therefore, a tongue is a language. An unknown tongue is simply a language you don't know. Paul said that without an interpreter, that people were to stay silent and not to speak in a tongue that people couldn't understand. I Corinthians 14:23,27,28
- 3) What about laying hands on sick people?

 The apostles and Jesus did this. Others that the apostles laid hands on would be able **if** they were given that gift, see I Cor. 12. Also See James 5:16.
- 4) Why can't you shout and raise your hands at that Church or run down the isle?

Where in the Bible do we read of people running down the isle? We just want to do what the Bible says. Shouting can lead to confusion. I Corinthians 14 says to let everything be done decently and in order. If more than one person is speaking at a time, how can you tell what is going on? We just want to worship the Lord in the way he talks about in the Bible. Don't misunderstand, if God said to shout in worship to Him, that's what I would do. But since, he doesn't tell us to do that in the New Testament, we simply follow the pattern of things that they were told to do in the New Testament church

What must I do?

- Hear the Gospel Acts 15:7
- Believe the Gospel Mark 16:15,16
- Repent of Sins Acts 17:30
- Confess Christ Rom. 10:9,10
- Be Baptized for the Forgiveness of Sins Acts 2:38

Then, as a Christian we must:

• LIVE FAITHFUL UNTO DEATH - REV. 2:10
