Church Growth

Concerning the important subject of church growth, David Womack has made the observation that churches tend to level off their growth at specific plateaus. He noted some of these

are: 125, 240, 400, 600, 800, and just under 1200.

He states that once a church is large enough to care for its own members, pay its own expenses, and establish a favorable image in the community, the congregation often loses momentum. Thus, they are lulled into the peaceful slumber of religious passivity.

Brethren, we must not allow this stagnation to happen at Mt. Gilead. Look at four things we must do to prevent it.

1. **REALIZE OUR WORK IS NEVER DONE EVEN THOUGH WE ARE MAKING PROGRESS.** You can recall in the O. T. that God gave Joshua the job of taking all the land of Canaan. For a while the people did well, but after they got enough to live comfortably, they stopped. God's response to Joshua was, "Thou are old and well stricken in years, but there remaineth yet very much land to be possessed" (Joshua 13:1). There are so many more precious souls that need to hear and know about our Lord. We cannot stop because we have enjoyed some success. We must march forward.
2. **INVOLVE MORE PEOPLE IN THE WORK.** Joshua was instructed to take the land and "Divide it as an inheritance, even among the people" (v. 8). A key to ensure church growth is more folks getting involved in its work. It is a serious mistake to think only a few can do **ALL** that must be done.
3. **BE PRAYERFUL.** After we have done everything from our involvement, the trust, faith, desire and dreams must be shared with God. We must persistently communicate with our Father in prayer concerning the growth of Scottsville. Remember: I Thess. 5:17,18.
4. **BE ENTHUSIASTIC.** When we have faith in God, in our being His special people and the serious need of saving the lost, then we can live with enthusiasm (God in us). This wonderful quality of life will keep the church pushing, dreaming, searching, and growing.
