QUICK TO LISTEN, SLOW TO SPEAK, SLOW TO ANGER

In James 1:19-27 James specifically reminds believers about the harm associated with a loose tongue and a lack of virtuous behavior:

19 So then,^[a] my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath; ²⁰ for the wrath of man does not produce the righteousness of God. ²¹ Therefore lay aside all filthiness and overflow of wickedness, and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls. ²² But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. ²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; ²⁴ for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. ²⁵ But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does. ²⁶ If anyone among you^[b] thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this one's religion is useless. ²⁷ Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world.

Remember that James' audience has already been persecuted and shunned by friends and family, and prosecuted by authorities who believed Christianity threatened civil authority. Finally, they were run out of town by religious zealots who believed they were apostates. Christians are refugees living among people who do not value the virtues taught by Christ, nor respect the words of God's prophets, or keep the traditions of the Law of Moses. To survive, believers must adapt to their new surroundings without adopting the sinful ways of the surrounding culture. In accomplishing this goal, James encourages these scattered believers to remain faithful in the godly discipline contained within God's word. Specifically, James offers believers three spiritual instructions to help them deal with the daily trials of life and retain a Christ-like attitude: be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry.

James' readers must engage these strangers daily to survive. They shop for food and barter for equipment and shelter. The ability to successfully accomplish these tasks literally means the difference between life and death. Thus, it is important to master interpersonal behavior and establish personal relationships with individuals who have little in common with them. With that backdrop and goals in mind, one should develop an even deeper appreciation for James' precious instructions:

Be quick to listen Hold one's tongue Control one's anger
These 3 spiritual attitudes result from the virtues of patience, wisdom, and love.

James goes on to instruct believers to avoid temptation by keeping a tight rein on their tongues; otherwise, they engage in self-deception and render their faith worthless! Finally, James contrasts deceptive behavior with an example of virtuous conduct that is a defining characteristic of a right relationship with God – "pure, faultless" — promoting acts of compassion towards the helpless, while abstaining from sinful worldly actions.
